Park scholarship candidates can access the special section of the application by either being endorsed by your high school or by self-endorsing • Each candidate must provide – the name of two recommenders, one official transcript, information about advanced coursework and two essays. The Thomas Wolfe Scholarship (UNC-Chapel Hill)		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Please note that the application process involves two separate steps and two different dates, and all applicants must take both steps and meet both deadlines: Thomas Wolfe Scholarship applicants must apply to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill by the University's October 15th, 2015 EARLY admission deadline and must meet all academic requirements for EARLY admission AND Scholarship applicants must also apply to The Thomas Wolfe Scholarship, with the deadline for submissions to the Scholarship being November 15th, 2015 (submissions must be postmarked by that date).
